Baltimore County Executive, Jim Smith, presented a check in the amount of \$275,000 to the Catonsville Emergency Food Ministries. This Grant, from the Office of Community Conservation will be used to acquire 25 Bloomsbury Avenue as a permanent location.

The Grant process was initiated by CEFM Executive Director, John Monck, almost three years ago with the assistance of Baltimore County Councilman, Sam Moxley.
